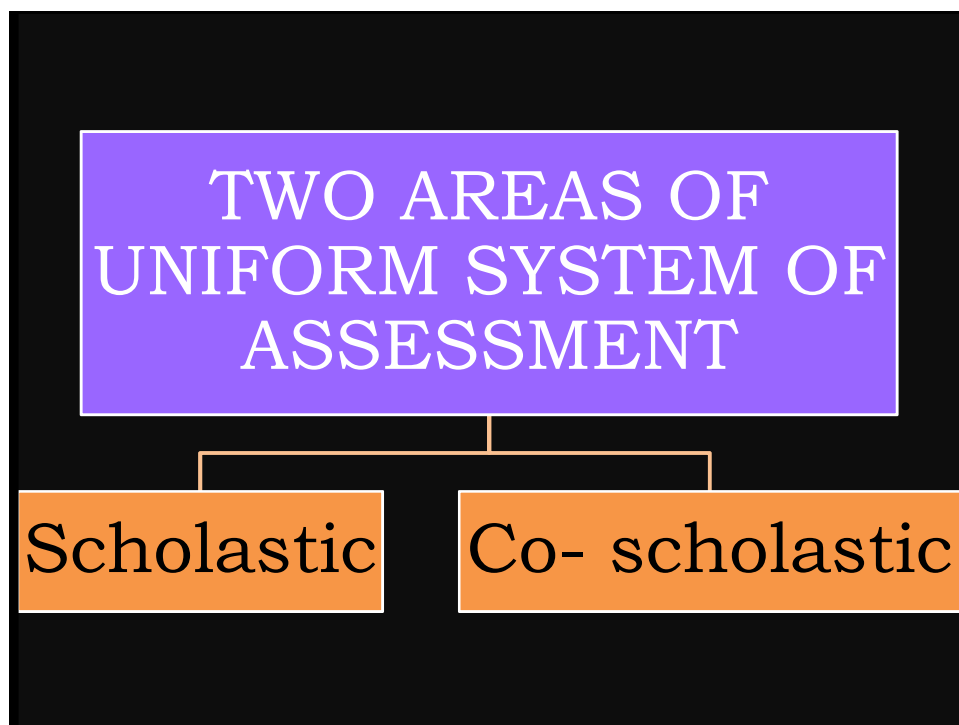
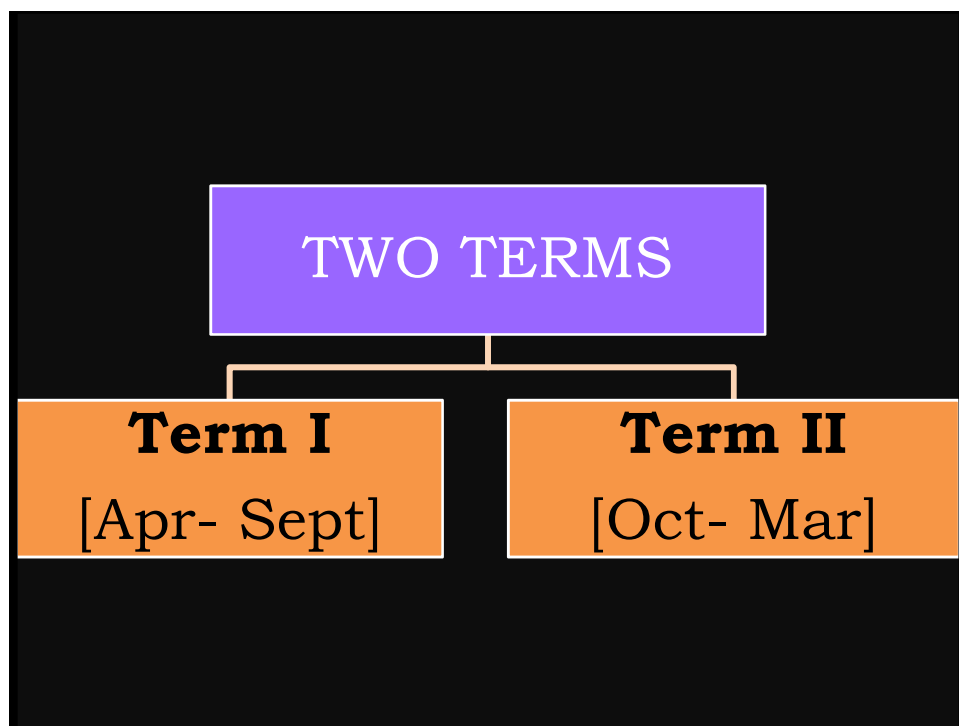


UNIFORM SYSTEM OF ASSESSMENT & EXAMINATION

- It carries a weightage of 5 marks
- It ensures regular and attentive participation of students in the class room transaction
- It is aimed at enhancing seriousness of students towards preparing different types of notes on the topics taught in class
- It enhances regularity, punctuality, neatness and booklet upkeep

ASSESSMENT OF BOOKLETS

- The following parameters are followed while assessing booklets:
 - **Regularity:** Students need to bring their notebooks regularly as per the time table
 - **Completion of assignment:** Class work and Home work
 - **Neatness & Upkeep:** Quality of work – Legible/ proper indexing/ date/ title/ labeling of topics/ creativity/ neatness/ drawing of diagrams are taken into consideration
