RONGALI BIHU: WHERE TRADITION MEETS CELEBRATION



On 30th April 2024, Don Bosco School celebrated its 17th Rongali Bihu function with great pomp and gaiety. The day commenced when the Chief Guest Dr. Dayanand Pathak and Guest of Honour Dr. Dharendra Chandra Sarma along with our Principal Rev. Fr. Sebastian Mathew and Vice Principal Rev. Fr. Saju Kariyil were escorted into the school by the school's NCC and Scouts and Guides cadets. They were welcomed by a Bihu dance performed by the students of the Primary Section who wore the traditional attire of different tribes of Assam. This was followed by the school prayer and prayer song. The gathering was addressed by our Vice Principal Rev. Fr. Saju Kariyil.

The programme commenced with the Bihu flag hoisting ceremony accompanied by the Bihu song "Shreemoyee Oxomi". Shortly after this, the guests were felicitated with a phulam gamusa, a japi and a bamboo plant. Following this, a few students of the Primary Section recited a poem. The chief guest then delivered an inspiring speech, elaborating on the meaning of the song that had been sung, and how it defined every person as a store house of power. Subsequently, the Bihu inaugural dance was performed, after which the guest of honour shared his thoughts, in which he laid emphasis on Assamese Bihu celebration and the emotion it brings, along with its relevance with the seasons and human behaviour and culture. The Inauguration Ceremony was concluded with the singing of the National Anthem.



In the Primary and Middle sections, a variety of Bihu competitions were held including Inter House Bihu song, instrument, poem and dance competition. Additionally, students shared tiffin in their classrooms, where they mostly brought Assamese traditional food – filling the atmosphere with aroma of doi (Curd), gur (Jaggery) and so on. Apart from this, various games like musical chairs, tunnel races, and the game of dropping a coin into a cap submerged in water from above were organized. Towards the end, a Bihu Art & Craft competition was also held.

In High School, the Art and Craft competition was held. Students also participated in Bihu exhibition competition held in the basketball court where there were displays of traditional items like gamosa, brass utensils, jetuka, kumura, including certain traditional delicacies. The High School students also enjoyed shared tiffin and participated in the Inter House Bihu competition. While the judges were determining the results, traditional games like 'Tekeli Bhanga' and 'Koni Juz' were also held.

Finally the much awaited Rongali Bihu Celebrations 2024-25 came to an end. It was a great day to remember and we all enjoyed the day to the fullest.

Great men lay there with tales of great glory and valour of tidings of immense patriotism and supreme sacrifice.
